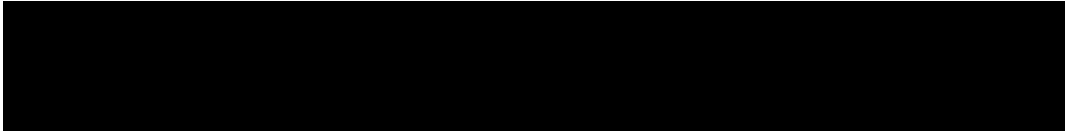

City OKs paving contract

MORGANTOWN — Morgantown City Council approved a \$675,743 contract with Parrotta Paving to resurface all or part of more than two dozen city streets this spring and summer.

When added to the \$792,800 contract council previously approved with Greer Industries for the asphalt, the first paving season since passage of the \$3 weekly user fee will cost \$1,468,543.

That number falls about \$1 million short of what the city was expecting to spend on paving this construction season.

City Engineer and Public Works Director Damien Davis explained why.

“We anticipated this to be a prevailing wage project, but the repeal of prevailing wage went into effect the day before the project was bid,” Davis said. “With that, this is not a prevailing wage project, so the bids came in lower than expected.”

The bid from Parrotta in particular.

Two other bidders made offers — Dodd General Contractors (\$1,117,530.66) and Mountaineer Contractors, Inc. (\$1,366,640.00).
